The rubbish bins are at the top of the road, turn right and the bins are a little further along.

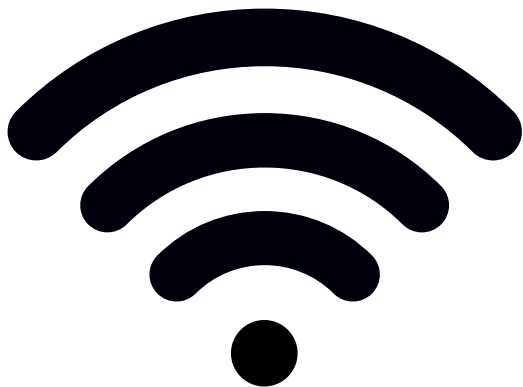

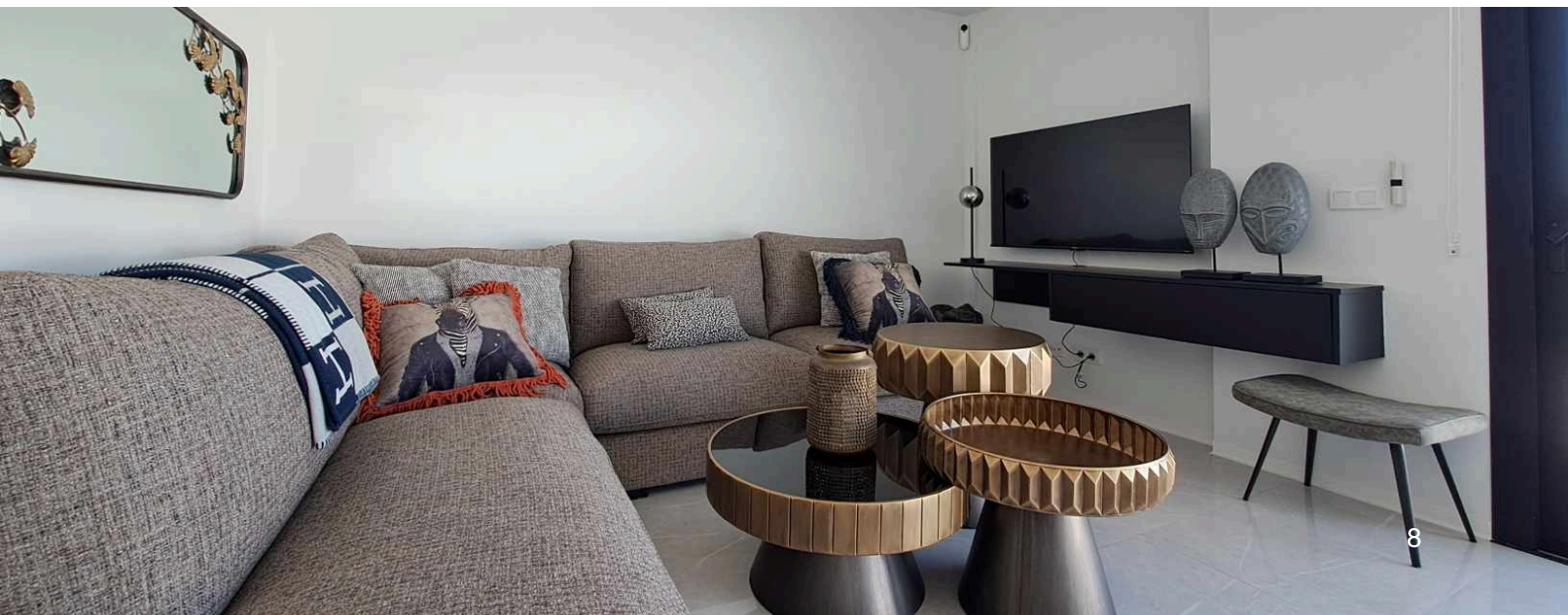

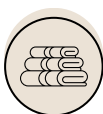

Alicante

SANTA CRUZ DISTRICT

At the foot of the Santa Barbara castle, on one of the slopes of Mount Benacantil, you'll find this small, white-painted district, the birthplace of the city. Take a stroll through the maze of narrow streets and staircases that characterise the district, whose opaline whiteness is enhanced by the many pots of geraniums and charming little squares.

On the higher ground of the district, you can visit the Santa Cruz hermitage, built by order of King Alfonso X the Wise in 1271, and an essential meeting point for locals and visitors alike. This is where its most popular fiestas are celebrated, especially those of the May Crosses and Holy Week, when the balconies are decorated for the occasion, with music, flowers and lots of emotion.

SANTA BARBARA CASTLE

Free admission. The Santa Barbara Castle gives Alicante a unique profile. From the highest point of the fortress, located in the city centre on Mount Benacantil, you can enjoy a breathtaking panoramic view over the Bay of Alicante, and on a clear day you can even make out the skyline of Benidorm or the island of Tabarca perfectly.

The ancient Muslim fortress on which the castle was built dates back to the ninth century, when the city was dominated by Muslims and Ali and the princess Cántara lived a great love story, becoming the protagonists of one of Alicante's most beautiful legends. A visit to the castle's ancient halls and courtyards is the perfect option for history lovers, who will be able to immerse themselves in Alicante's cultural wealth, as well as for those who want to find out the outcome of the ancient and passionate legend of Cara del Moro.

BASILICA OF SANTA MARIA

The former Muslim mosque gave way in the 13th century to this sumptuous Catholic basilica, which can be considered one of the churches with the greatest heritage value in the Spanish Levant. It is a veritable living museum.

THE PORT OF ALICANTE

The port of Alicante is one of the most beautiful places to enjoy the sunset and gradually watch the sky change colour and with it the profile of the Santa Barbara castle, the buildings and the boats whose reflection on the water paints an immense watercolour.



THE ESPLANADE

The Explanada promenade is one of the city's main avenues and one of its most popular tourist spots. Sheltered by palm trees, the Explanada's colourful floor is made up of millions of tiny tiles, creating a sea of white, red and black waves.



ST NICOLAS CATHEDRAL

Situated in the heart of Alicante's historic centre, the Cathedral of Saint Nicholas of Bari is the city's main religious building, and home to its patron saints: the Virgen del Remedio and Saint Nicholas himself.

Although the exterior is sober, the Renaissance interior of the church contains works of art of great interest, such as the Communion Chapel, the Baroque organ, which is the oldest in the Valencian Community, and imagery gems such as the 17th-century Christ of the Good Death.



THE TOWN HALL

Alicante's eighteenth-century Town Hall is a magnificent Baroque palace built of limestone from the nearby Serra Grossa, with balconies and flanked by two towers linked by galleries. One of the towers, the most northerly, is adorned with a clock that plays the city's anthem every hour, so it's customary to go to the square to hear the chimes ring out. The first step of the building's main staircase is sea level 0, the reference point for this measurement throughout Spain.

Villajoyosa

Villajoyosa. It evokes joy, colour and, of course, beauty. 'La Vila Joiosa' is a town open to the sea, whose historic centre is made up of hundreds of colourful houses, once inhabited by fishermen, sheltered by the ancient medieval walls.

Even today, the port plays an essential role in the daily life of Villajoyosa. Its fish market is one of the most important in the Mediterranean and, every afternoon, fishermen continue to use traditional techniques such as trammel nets to guarantee the best quality fish and seafood for which Villajoyosa is renowned.

Leaving the promenade and entering the labyrinth of narrow streets, the Church of the Annunciation is another essential visit to Villajoyosa, a building halfway between the gothic and renaissance styles whose majesty is a silent reminder of the historical importance the town has had over the centuries.

The 'La Barbera dels Aragonés' Museum is housed in a farmhouse and boasts an extensive collection of decorative objects and everyday items dating from the 17th to the 20th centuries. The farmhouse belonged to the Aragonés family, landowners who held important military posts from the Middle Ages to the 19th century. When the family died out in 1992, the mas became municipal property. After extensive renovation work, it was converted into a museum.

The ethnographic and archaeological museum was created in 1975 by a group of collaborators who had collected numerous objects local heritage.

In the course of successive excavations in the municipality, remains from the Roman and Islamic periods were discovered.

from the Roman and Islamic periods. These are now housed in the museum, which boasts a remarkable collection and supports educational activities linked to archaeological conservation, dissemination and research. The collection is spread over 120 square metres. The exhibition features some astonishing objects, such as an oriental necklace dating from the 6th century BC (one of the most unusual pieces of Phoenician gold jewellery on the peninsula) iron weapons, as well as objects dating back to 600 BC.

The Chocolates Valor factory and museum offer an exceptional gastronomic experience in Villajoyosa. The museum dedicated to this industry was created in 1998 and is housed in a nineteenth-century house. from the 19th century. All tours are guided and free of charge. The tour passes through the museum and the old house that once housed the factory. Here you can the history of chocolate from its origins to the present day.

Benidorm

Benidorm is one of the best-known destinations in the Mediterranean thanks to the quality of its beaches, its year-round warm climate and the wide range of daytime and night-time leisure activities that make it a unique destination for its visitors, a city also known as 'Spain's New York' and one of the most visited tourist beaches in Europe.

The Poniente beach with its promenade, the Levante beach with its multitude of bars and restaurants on the seafront or the Castell Mirador in Benidorm are perhaps the main points of tourist interest.

What's more, Benidorm is a fun destination with a variety of leisure options, including the Benidorm Palace, one of Europe's top-rated party venues. Suitable and entertaining for all ages and, above all, highly recommended for trips with children.

MEDITERRANEAN BALCONY

Isla Tabarca

The province of Alicante has a small inhabited island, very close to the coast, with a lot to offer.

Only around fifty people live there all year round. The island of Tabarca is a magical place, rich in nature and overflowing with tradition, but without roads or supermarkets. With the arrival of summer, it becomes one of the most popular destinations on the Costa Blanca. It is in fact a small archipelago whose main island, called Nueva Tabarca or Isla Pla-na, is surrounded by the smaller islands of La Nao, La Cantera and La Galera.

But while the landscape is interesting, with the whimsical shapes of bushes carved by the wind and prickly pear trees everywhere, its real treasure lies in the rich seabed that surrounds the archipelago and led to Tabarca being designated Spain's first marine reserve in 1986. Tabarca has more than 5 kilometres of coastline where you can find a secluded spot to swim in peace and quiet. What's more, a multitude of small coves dot the coastline, offering splendid panoramic views of the island's crystal-clear waters. It's the perfect place to capture a photo of what promises to be the best day of your summer.

Altea

It's a city of artists, and so much so that its historic centre is home to the Faculty of Fine Arts of the province of Alicante. For decades, its streets have been a favourite destination for painters, scientists, writers and singers, who spend long periods here to take a break and find inspiration.

The streets climb the small hill on which the town is built, while the immaculate white houses vie for sea views. Instead of squares, Altea boasts an infinite number of vantage points where you can let the hours fly by, gazing at the horizon while listening to street musicians in the background.

The incomparable blue dome of the church of Nuestra Señora del Consuelo overlooks the city at the highest point in the historic centre, making it the perfect place to take a stroll, grab an ice cream or buy local crafts in one of the pretty shops around the church.

Font del Algar

This is certainly one of the most famous spots on the Costa Blanca. Located in the municipality of Callosa d'En Sarrià, not far from Benidorm, they form a series of waterfalls, natural pools and deep natural pools along the river.

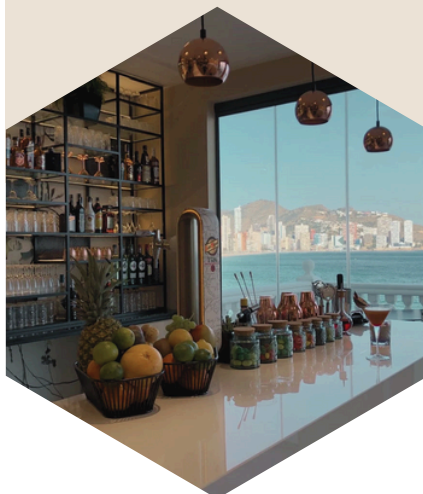

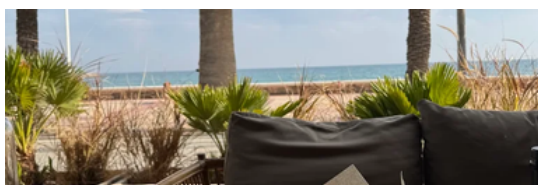

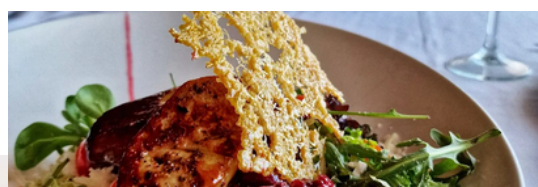

To read!

Introduction

The property rented to you is equipped to meet your needs during your holiday. You will find furniture, bedding, crockery, bed linen and towels. As soon as you enter the accommodation, you will be able to make an inventory of fixtures and report any defects (cleanliness, damage to equipment, etc.) within 24 hours.

Arrival and departure

On the day of your arrival, the accommodation will be available from 4pm. Please do not hesitate to contact us to organise the handover of the keys and a tour of the property. In the event of unauthorised late arrival or departure, a supplement of 35€/hour will be applied.

Number of tenants and external visitors

We rent our accommodation to you for the precise number of holidaymakers, defined at the time of booking as 6, as set out in the rental contract. If you wish to welcome visitors during your stay, please ask for our prior agreement. Guests not included in the booking are not permitted to sleep on site. The total number of occupants must not exceed 6.

Quiet hours and respect for neighbours

Please keep noise to a minimum at night (between 10pm and 8am) so as not to disturb the neighbours.

Parties and events within the rental property

Parties, events and large gatherings are not permitted in our holiday accommodation. Commercial filming and other professional use of the property is strictly prohibited.

They will make good use of the equipment and maintain the accommodation so that it is in perfect condition when they leave.

Kitchen utensils, oil, spices, bathroom products and cleaning products are entirely at your disposal during your holiday. You are not allowed to move the furniture.

The wifi password giving you an internet connection is confidential information. Please do not share it with anyone outside the group.

The air conditioners in the bedrooms and living room must be switched off when you leave the accommodation or when the windows are open.

The accommodation has an alarm. Check that the doors and windows (bedrooms, living rooms and kitchen) are closed before lowering the shutters, lights and ceiling fans when you leave the accommodation.

The oven, microwave, fridge, crockery, barbecue/plancha must be cleaned when you leave.

Never unplug the box or television.

Food is not permitted in the rooms.

In the event of an accident or breakage, it is your responsibility to inform your host before you leave.

In the event of damage to property or the villa being returned in a very dirty state (including damaged bed linen/clothes), additional cleaning/laundry hours will be charged (and will be justified by a report and photos). 30€ per extra hour of cleaning, more if the damage requires the intervention of an outside company.



RULES OF PROCEDURE

To read!

If a key or the gate box is lost, you will be charged for its replacement. 150 per complete set of keys. If you forget your keys indoors and need to make a journey to open the door, you will be charged €50 for the journey. If the damage caused results in a delay to the arrival of subsequent travellers or the need to cancel their reservation, you will be required to pay compensation.

Welcome booklet

All passengers must read the information in the welcome booklet.

General safety instructions

As hosts, we cannot be held responsible for theft, loss or damage to the accommodation if it is not properly locked (windows and front door locked). Similarly, please do not leave any electrical or household appliances switched on during your absence.

There is an alarm connected to the police. The camera is only activated in the event of an intrusion.

Please do not leave young children unsupervised in the rental property or near the swimming pool.

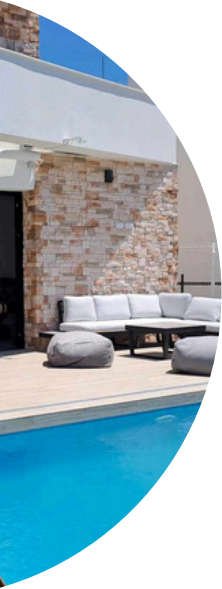
The villa has staircases (R+1, please be vigilant about their use by young children).
